Spaghetti Dinner Saturday, March 29



Dear Saints,



Grace, mercy and peace be unto you in the holy Name of Jesus our Saviour. Soon we will begin our sixteenth Lenten journey to Easter together here at Salem Church. We will begin of course, on Ash Wednesday which is 5 March 2025 at 7:00 PM. At that service, we will hear again the exhortation:

Brothers and sisters: God created us to experience joy in communion with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all of his creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. Also, by our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under his judg-

ment, but to turn to him and live.

As disciples of the Lord Jesus we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor. Repentance, fasting, prayer, and works of love—the discipline of Lent—help us to wage our spiritual warfare. I invite you, therefore, to commit yourselves to this struggle and confess your sins, asking our Father for strength to persevere in your Lenten discipline.

It's called spiritual warfare for a reason. To carry these things out during an entire season (remember Sundays are Resurrection Days and thus the Lenten discipline is lifted) is tough. That's the point. It's not that we are doing Lent but Lent is done to us. It shows us how we are unable in any way to carry out or fulfill the law. We all will fall short. I want to encourage to stay with the Lenten disciplines even when you fail. It's designed to show you failure. Pick it up the next day. Some things to consider for your Lenten discipline:

- Consider fasting on Fridays, the day of our Lord's crucifixion. Perhaps skip a meal or have a
 lesser meal. Fish on Fridays is an old custom and perhaps you may want to consider
 abstaining from meat on Fridays as a discipline. Consider fasting before coming to the Holy
 Communion. You will find yourself hungering for our Lord Christ in a new way.
- Study your Small Catechism. "The Small Catechism guides us into the heart of the Holy Scriptures, for it is, as the Formula of Concord (one of our Confessional Documents in the Book of Concord) would come to call it, "a Bible of the Laity, in which everything is summarized that is treated in detail in Holy Scripture and that is necessary for a Christian to know for salvation."
- Read one of the Gospels over the Lenten season. Consider using the Lutheran Study Bible from Concordia Publishing House or the English Standard Version Study Bible to aid you in your study.
- Build into your day prayer. Get up a little bit earlier and pray the Morning Prayer from the Small Catechism and at night the Evening Prayers. Pray during your meals as you find in your Small Catechism. "A Christian without prayer is just as impossible as a living person without a pulse." Martin Luther


